Dear Ms. Kalapos:

In conjunction with the Ohio Department of Transportation’s (ODOT’s) assurance to maintain the integrity of the U.S. Department of Transportation’s Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program and ODOT’s commitment to the Federal Highway Administration, ODOT performed an audit of DBE firms in the Ohio Unified Certification Program (UCP) DBE directory that have done or continue to do business with ODOT. This audit involved a review of North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes and descriptors currently assigned to the DBE firms to ensure such are consistent with 49 CFR §26.71(n)(1) and (3) as well as to the certification standards outlined in 49 CFR Part 26, Subpart D.

Currently, as a result of the audit and review of your Annual Declaration, your firm is certified in the following NAICS codes and descriptors effective December 29, 2016:

DBE certification allows your firm to participate as a DBE on federally assisted projects and/or contracts. Your firm is subject to the requirements of the DBE regulations (49 CFR Part 26, as amended) and all laws of the State of Ohio applicable to the transaction of business. A copy of your certificate can be viewed or printed from the Ohio UCP DBE directory at www.dot.state.oh.us/Divisions/ODI/SDBE/Pages/DBE-Directory.aspx.

As a DBE, you are required to inform ODOT in writing of any change in circumstances affecting your ability to meet the size, disadvantaged status, ownership, or control requirements of the DBE regulations or any material change

in the information provided in your application form. The notice must take the form of a sworn affidavit or of an unsworn declaration executed under penalty of perjury of the laws of the United States. You must provide the written notification and supporting documentation describing in detail the nature of the change(s) within 30 days of the occurrence of the change(s). Failure to provide timely notification will result in ODOT's action to decertify your firm's eligibility as a DBE with the Ohio UCP.

As a DBE, you are also required to submit an Annual Declaration attesting to your continued status as a socially and economically disadvantaged individual, and that there have been no changes in your firm's circumstances affecting its ability to meet the size, disadvantaged status, ownership, or control requirements of the DBE regulations or any material changes in the information provided in your application form (except for the changes about which you have already notified ODOT, if any) along with your current Federal business tax returns each year on your anniversary date, which is **January 17**. You may submit the Annual Declaration by following the instructions in the Forms for Certified DBE Firms section of the Ohio UCP website at <http://www.dot.state.oh.us/Divisions/ODI/SDBE/Pages/UCP.aspx>.

Also, please note that your certification does not automatically expire; however, your firm must submit the Annual Declaration annually on or before your firm's anniversary date. Failure to provide the requested documents in a timely manner will result in ODOT's action to decertify your firm's eligibility as a DBE with the Ohio UCP.

Please be advised a firm is not eligible to retain NAICS codes in all or some of the areas of work grouped under the NAICS codes if that firm exceeds the size standard listed under the NAICS codes. If a firm exceeds the size standard in any of its approved NAICS codes, it is no longer certified as a DBE under that specific NAICS code. If a firm exceeds the size standard in all of its approved NAICS codes or the established Personal Net Worth standard, it is no longer eligible to participate as a DBE.
